\$27,000 in Emergency Financial Assistance for Clients. Gifts of \$75 - \$1,000 can make an essential difference due to the impact of epilepsy.

Epilepsy can create a range of challenges for individuals and families that can result in short-term financial hardships. Epilepsy Foundation New England offers resources to help members in our epilepsy community in times of need, bringing financial assistance to people living with epilepsy.



"My 13-year-old daughter Meg has intractable seizures that limit her ability to walk, talk, and do any daily living tasks on her own. Her seizures occur daily and can be scary at times when her oxygen drop interventions are needed. Meg is completely wheelchair bound.

We sought funds to put a wheelchair accessible bathroom and bedroom in our garage for her. She has a walk-in shower in the basement and I had been carrying her down the stairs. However she is now 80 pounds, and it is not safe for me to carry her any longer. Converting our garage into her room was the least expensive option we had but it is expensive. I applied for financial assistance to help cover some of the costs.

The gift of \$1,000 helped purchase materials to finish the project. Thank you Epilepsy Foundation New England."




No. of S.H.A.R.E. groups Epilepsy Foundation New England offers
